





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There is a national focus on reskilling, upskilling and building an inclusive recovery.


However, immigrants, refugees, and speakers of other languages are often kept out of education and training programs because they do not have the required English skills.




We tend to think of lack of English skills as an **insurmountable obstacle,** but that just is not true.

Advances in technology and recent research in cognitive science have shown us how to rapidly unlock language skills.

There is a readiness gap between ESL programs and technical or business development training

English training is **acquiring a skill**, not studying a content area.






TASK-BASED LANGUAGE TEACHING (TBLT)


